Janaha Ransome Tribute

June 20, 1983 - December 8, 2013

Janaha Ransome was the co-founder and a vital committee member of the F.A.N.C.Y. Teen Girls Expo, founded in 2010. One of her primary goals was to further her education and have a meaningful career path that would transform young lives.

Janaha grew up in Southeastern San Diego, attending SCPA and Mt. Miguel High School. She obtained an Associate's Degree from Grossmont College, a Bachelor's Degree in Africana Studies from UCSD, and a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the University of Phoenix. While in pursuit of her PhD from Alliant University, she transitioned from this life on December 8, 2013. Alliant University granted Janaha with an Honorary Doctorate Degree.

Within her lifetime she contributed to many youth through being an inspiration with an undeniable drive to change the

world one milestone at a time. Janaha spearheaded several community projects, including implementing President Obama's Youth Employment Program through Metro San Diego and implementing after school youth programs in San Diego and Oceanside school districts through her Assistant Director position at the ARC of San Diego. Upon her passing, as a strong leader and advocate in the community, Janaha was employed as the Youth Manager at the San Diego Workforce Partnership, the CEO of Building Dreams LLC, and was in the process of developing STAR Academy Charter School.

The F.A.N.C.Y. Teen Girls Expo Committee now honors Janaha's service through the "I'm F.A.N.C.Y. Scholarship" Program, in remembrance of her never-ending support and dedication to improving the lives of youth from underserved communities.

Taryell Simmons is a Training Specialist for the San Diego Workforce Partnerships CONNECT2Careers program, a youth employment program that aligns the career aspirations of young adults with businesses that are committed to developing our emerging workforce. Previously, Taryell worked as a Program Specialist building relations and creating employment opportunities with San Diego business. He is passionate about identifying the skills that employers need and training young job seekers to meet that demand. I think it's important to teach young adults the skill they need to be successful in today's economy. We refer to these skills as "soft skills" or "essential skills".



Tasha Williamson

Growing up in South Central Los Angeles, Tasha was aware of the violence that plagued her community. Having survived sexual abuse, domestic violence, and suicide attempts, Tasha was also inspired by a high school teacher. Her passion for activism began early, at 16, she led the fight for multi-cultural classes to be taught in classrooms. The school board unanimously approved the change.

One of Tasha's biggest accomplishments is being a mother, she has four beautifully talented children; Jabril, Khalil, Ajanai and Caleb. During their childhood, she often reflected on the words of a stranger, "Remember your kids are sponges, they will follow you, they will reflect what you do, and they will become you because you are the most important model in their lives!"

Tasha is one of three co-founders of San Diego Compassion Project. Since 2008, the organization has supported over 130 families and 7500 individuals who have lost loved ones to violence, suicide, and other causes. She also serves as a consultant for C.A.S.T. where she assists the public by working with other organizations and government agencies that help victims and families impacted by violence.

Tasha has completed numerous classes about community crisis, conflict resolution, violence and suicide prevention. She also conducts law enforcement support through Community Engagement Police Bus Tours and Trainings. In recognition of her contributions, Williamson has received awards from President Barack Obama, The California Wellness Foundation 2013 Peace Prize, and the United States Congressional Office, along with a host of others.

Tasha currently serves as Director for Center For Community Cohesion with the National Conflict Resolution Center. Along with her team, they work to support and transform the community and schools restoratively and serve those impacted by complex traumas and the prison pipeline.
